The Bloomville residence of the C. F. Staub family.



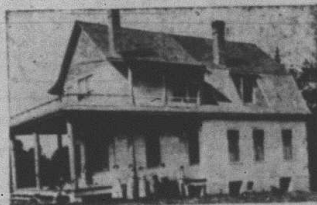
John Geiss and family photographed in front of their home at Merrill R.F.D. 5 in the early 1900's.

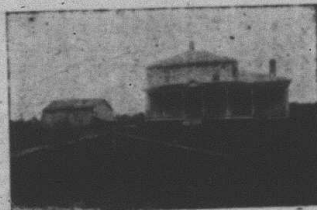

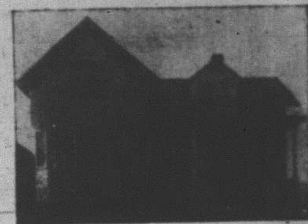
The Andrew Donovan home some 50 years ago in Merrill.



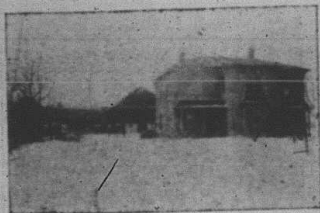
Heller, Wis., residence of Mr. and Mrs. H. Bessey and family.

Turn of the Century photo shows home of Mr. and Mrs. A. H. Granke of Irma.



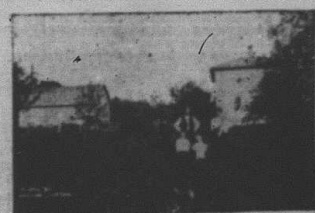
