Anderson, who was teaching in the one room-chieblouse located on the southwest rooper of the present Lincoln school rounds, for her to O.K. Miss Anderson counted the pages, and told them Mr. Merrill would consign such a letter to the waste-basket without even tooking at it. So they asked her to write a letter, which she states was less than one third of a business sheet.
