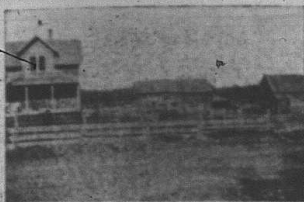
George Helmsteadter, one of the oldest living pioneer residents.

Farm residence of Mr. and Mrs. Wm. Prochnow as it appeared about 1900.



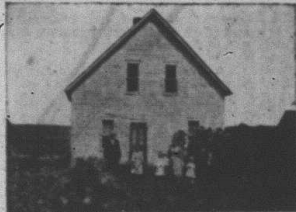
The residence of Carl Haas at 906 W 2nd St. taken about fifty years ago.

Early Gleason residence of Edward Lueck family at Gleason.



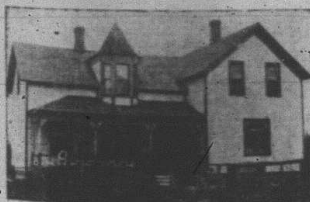
Elm Grove Farm was the residence of Peter Waldburger in 1913 at Irma.



1900's farm scene at the home of Otto Frick at Heller.



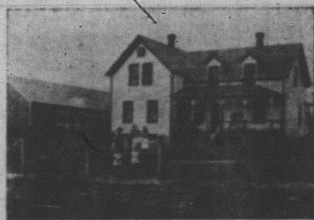
